**Mabel Ida Allen**, 94 of Paterson, NJ died peacefully in her sleep on Tuesday, September 20, 2016. She was born March 29, 1922 in Accomac, Virginia. She ensured that grandchildren's toddler shoes and clothing were purchased by her, personally taking the kids to Stride Rite for their "Buster Brown" fittings. She outfitted the grands at Jacobs, Meyer Brothers and Plymouth Department Stores. Mabel always rewarded, giving cash to family and friends for all occasions, deeds or just because she was thinking of you.

Above all, Mabel loved the Lord. She was saved in her youth and raised her children at the New AME Zion Paterson. Her favorite songs included, "I must tell Jesus all of my troubles" and " Dear God". She was demonstrative and forthcoming, rebuking foolishness! You knew where you stood with Mabel and did not want to provoke her ire.

Experiencing the African American struggles from her southern roots through the election of the 1st Black President, Mabel was socially and politically astute. She regularly watched Paterson City Council meetings and implored her son Vernon to bring up citizen issues during his open mike in city council chambers. As a final act of civic responsibility, Mabel completed and submitted her absentee ballot for the upcoming election.

She leaves to cherish precious memories, son Clifton Allen of Paterson; daughters, Linda Allen (Ricky) of Paterson and Mildred Allen Alexander (Randy) of Matthews, NC; Two grandsons, Jason Allen (Tara) of East Orange, NJ and Clifton Allen, Jr. of Las Vegas, Nevada; Six grand daughters, Syreetta Allen of Paterson, Michelle Cook (Orlando) of Concord, NC, Marcia Ruben (Cullen) of Fanwood, NJ, Dawn Caldwell of East Orange, NJ, Sharisse Alexander of Charlotte, NC and Katrina Alexander of Matthews, NC. She was a great grandmother to six (Cullen, Jr., Syrai, Jamal, Jasmine, Zavi and Shakeerah).
