Elizabeth 'Bradford' Dash, lovingly called "**Tot**", was born February 21, 1929 to the late Tessie Josephine 'Jackson' and Lanie Bradford in Sumter, South Carolina.

She migrated to Brooklyn, New York in 1947, where she attended public school and graduated from Sarah Jay Hale High. In 1950, Elizabeth Bradford met and married Leon Dash. They raised and instilled in their seven children the following values: to remember God in the days of their youth, to show

themselves friendly, to protect their family, and to love and pray for one another. Her children understood that they were blessed to be a blessing.
