He was taught in the Maplewood and Irvington School Systems.

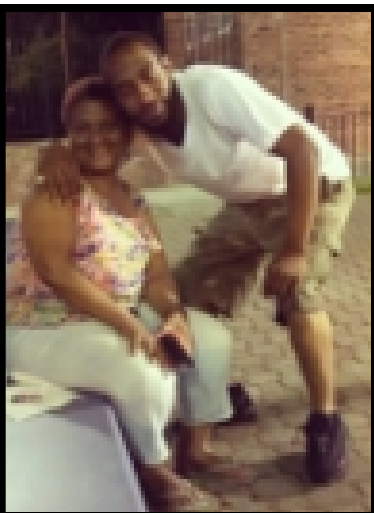
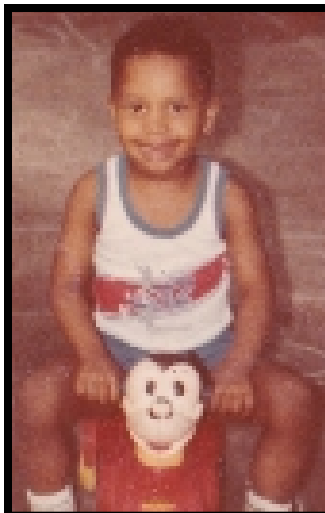
Lawrence was also known to family and friends and "L" or L-Boogie. He was well known and loved by many.
