#### <u>Obituary</u>

**Marilyn Frances** (**DeFreece**) **Bowles** was born on May 27, 1939 in Orange, NJ to the late Albert Martin DeFreece, Sr. and the late Olive Frances (Burke) DeFreece. She had one brother, Albert, Jr., who preceded her in death. She departed this life on October 22, 2016 after a challenging illness.

Marilyn was a life-long resident of Orange, NJ, receiving her education in the Orange Public School system. She was an exemplary student. She attended Oakwood Avenue School from Kindergarten – 7<sup>th</sup> grade where she was a "Star" Honor Roll student, earning straight A's every marking period. She then attended Central Junior High (8<sup>th</sup> grade). She graduated from Orange High School in 1957, where she not only maintained her high academic standing, but was also involved in the Basketball, Banking, Honor Roll, Orange PEAL (newspaper), and various other clubs. Her ambition was to become a School Teacher. In 1962 she earned a BA in Elementary Education from Newark State Teacher's College and later, in 1976, received her Master's degree and her Supervisor/Principal Certification from the same college. She was the first in her family to attend college.

Marilyn began her career teaching fourth grade at Camden Street School in Newark, NJ. In February of 1967 she transferred to Sussex Avenue School, Newark NJ. She taught several grades during her career at Sussex; however, she loved teaching fourth grade. That was her favorite! She began serving as Vice Principal of Sussex Avenue School in 1978. There was a nine month period that Marilyn served as acting Principal at Maple Avenue Annex. Other than that she remained at Sussex Avenue School until she retired on January 23, 1998.

Marilyn grew up attending Union Baptist Church in Orange, NJ. She went to Sunday School, sang in the choir and participated in various other activities within the church. After a long separation Marilyn restored her membership and active participation in the Union Baptist Church family. She attended Bible Study/Prayer service and Adult Church School. There were times when she taught the Adult Church School class in the regular teacher's absence. She joined the Usher Board and was later elevated to Deaconess.

During high school, Marilyn met, and sometime thereafter, married the late Alfonso Lee Bowles. They had four children. She loved her family and was a very supportive wife, mother and grandmother. However, if she didn't agree with something you said or did she would let you know!

In her leisure time, Marilyn enjoyed bowling. She bowled on several leagues and received many trophies. She bowled up until the time of her illness. She also liked to read, watch sporting events and make beautiful scrapbooks. She loved history, especially black history and made a scrapbook dedicated to it. She was very stylish in her dress and had a fondness for jewelry.

Marilyn loved the Lord, her family and her church. During her extended illness she was sustained by her strong and unwavering faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. She fought the Good Fight of faith and made a strong witness to the power and presence of God to comfort and to sustain. We are confident that absent from the body she is now present with the Lord.

She leaves to cherish her memory: 4 children: Sonia Ayscue, Cheryl Bowles Hill, Donna Bowles and Robert Bowles; four granddaughters: Sienna Robinson, India Hill, Mariah Ayscue and Ayana Ayscue; one great grandson: Malcolm Lucas; 1 son-in-law: Victor Hill; A very close cousin: Chanda Moore and a host of other family members and friends.
