

Obituary



James Arthur Whitmire was born the third oldest of fifteen children on the 16th day of January 1937 in Laurens, South Carolina to the late John W. Whitmire and Orrie (Phillips) Whitmire.

He was educated in the Laurens County School System. In order to help take care of this family, James left school and started work at the Underground Glass Factory with his father by the early age of sixteen. At the age of eighteen, he enlisted in the US Army where he received an honorable discharge. After two years of service in the military, James left the South to begin a new life in New Jersey.

On the 8th of July 1975, James married his beloved wife, Lunell (Hannah) Whitmire. 
