Marjorie Elizabeth Grant was born on April 7, 1953 in Kingston, Jamaica. She was the third of seven children born to Isoline and Walter Grant.

Growing up, Marjorie was inseparable from her parents. Throughout her life, their welfare and well being were always her top priority. Isoline and Walter Grant created a truly loving home where they taught their children the importance of family, faith and tradition. One longstanding tradition in the Grant family was gathering around the table to play an intense game of dominoes. Marjorie's father, Walter, was an avid player and instilled a deep love of the game in his seven children. Following the example of her parents Marjorie was a woman of strong faith. She was baptized at the Emmanuel Hope Baptist Church in Montclair, NJ and her unwavering faith in God remained a cornerstone throughout her life.

Marjorie always took great pride in her appearance and presentation. Her impeccable sense of style was just as present in her youth as it was in adulthood. In Jamaica, she went to Kingston Technical School where her poise, flair for fashion, and decorum seldom went unnoticed.
