Ann graduated from Morgan State University with a Bachelor of Science. While attending Morgan State, Ann was initiated into the Alpha Delta Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Incorporated. She received a Masters Degree in Health and Physical Education from Columbia University. She also received a Masters in Student Personnel Services from Montclair State and Kean College. Additionally, Ann earned a scholarship to begin work towards her Doctorate in dance from U.S.C.

A dancer all of her life, Ann studied at the New York City Ballet and with Katherine Dunham, Jose Limon, Martha Graham and June Taylor. Ann also danced with Carmen Delavallada in the movie "Lydia Bailey." Ann returned to Morgan State where she organized the first dance department whose dancers performed on the field at halftime during the football games. She was the proud mother of daughters Terri Freeman Johnson and Penni Jade Green and the very proud grand mother of grand daughter Dasia Brianna Green.
