Annie Laura (Lassiter) Bostic was born in Eufaula, Alabama on April 5, 1913. She was one of nine children born to her parents, Rosa and Zachariah Lassiter, and has five brothers and three sisters. Only one brother, Samuel Lassiter, is the last surviving member of her immediate family.

Annie Laura was educated in Eufaula where she grew up. She met and married Floyd Bostic. Sr. and gave birth to her only child, a son named Floyd Bostic, Jr. in 1929.

Annie Laura left Alabama and lived in Detroit for a short while before moving to Newark, New Jersey where she worked in various manufacturing capacities. After being separated and divorced for over twenty years, Annie and Floyd were reunited and remarried in the early 1960's. Because love is always better the "second time around," Annie and Floyd built a home and shared their lives together in Atlanta, Georgia. They opened their home and shared their life with Annie's niece, Angela Lassiter, whom they helped raise and educate.
