#### Obituary

The life of **Mother Henrietta Smalls** began on February 4, 1923 in Lake City South Carolina; she was born to the union of Cephas & Irene Milford. She was the 5th sibling of 9 children, Hester, Ethel, Bertha, Samuel Milford "Son", Daniel, Forest, and Stienny. June 1, 1937 Mo. Smalls married Walter Daniel Smalls in St. Steven South Carolina. Mother Smalls and Walter Smalls begot 7 children; predeceased Blondell, pre-deceased Sylverine, pre-deceased Emma Lee, pre-deceased Felicia, Walter Daniel Smalls, Rochelle Smalls, and Debra Smalls- Dudley. She has 17 Grandchildren, 18 Great-Grand Children, and 18 Great-Great Grandchildren along with a host of nieces and nephews that refer to her as Aunt Henny.

In 1955 Mother Smalls migrated up north to find work. She went to an agency and was hired as a maid by Mrs. Betty Thomas- Adams. She also became the caregiver of their children Paul & Judy, up until this day she is still regarded as part of their family and second mother.

In the late 1950's early 60's Mother Smalls traveled back and forth between New Jersey and South Carolina. The Thomas's built Mother Smalls her own living quarters at their home in Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey which gave her the opportunity to bring her family to New Jersey. While Walter her husband began working for Mr. Thomas in Northvale, New Jersey they were able to acquire an apartment in Paterson, New Jersey where they lived until they purchased their first home in Englewood, New Jersey in 1967.

Mother Smalls was saved at a young age, she later attended the Bible Institute at Soul Saving Station in New York City, where she graduated with honors along with her longtime friend Sylvia Marshall. She attended victory temple where she met one of her closest friends Pastor Dorothy Neal. Later she joined Refuge Temple Church of God in Christ under the leadership of Elder Vincent Kitchings where she served as; Pastors Assistant, Prayer Warrior, Sunday School teacher, President of the Women's Department, and President of the Northwestern District Mother's Board.

She is and has been a faithful member of Refuge Temple for over 30 years. After the passing of Elder Vincent Kitchings she remained at Refuge Temple under the leadership of Pastor Dennis Peterson and current Pastor George Akins. Through her leadership qualities she taught many that the quality of a good leader is: timeliness, temperance, longsuffering and faithfulness.

Mother Smalls is well loved and has always shown herself friendly, hospitable, and kind. She is affectionately called "Mamma" by a host of friends, family and church affiliations.
