<u> Obituary</u>

Inez Boseman, born November 13, 1920, was the fifth and last child born to the late Eddie Lee (Oliver) and Walter Ikner. Born in Troy, Alabama, Inez also grew up in Birmingham. She graduated from Helicon Elementary School and Parker High School both in Alabama. Upon her high school graduation her parents were encouraged by her older siblings to send her "north" to attend college. Although that didn't happen, Inez was always quick to remind her children she was "anybody's college material". However, it was in New Jersey she met and married the late Arthur Boseman, Sr.

Widowed at an early age, Inez understood the need for a woman to be independent. Inez held many jobs in New Jersey, including working as a waitress, domestic laborer, and finally found her calling in the position of home health aide with the Chr-Ill home health Agency—where she was recognized as a Home Health Aide of the Month. Her clients loved her as she became a part of their family, attending their family events, and remaining in contact with her even after the passing of their loved one.

Although she enjoyed reading and dancing (the jitterbug), she was also an avid sports fan, prompting her grandchildren to call her often to ask "who she liked?" at championship times. By far her greatest skill and joy came from cooking. She made it seem effortless, and at the age of 89 cooked her annual Christmas dinner for 39 people. Her greatest expressed regret was that she never opened a restaurant.

Inez was a firm and devout believer. Always in church, she was always a worker – co-chairing the Jr. Missionary youth group and other positions at her beloved Abyssinian Baptist Church (Newark) she would move on to become a Founding member and officer of the Genesis Missionary Baptist Church (Newark). Growing older and seeking a church closer to her residence, she was encouraged to visit and eventually joined Bethel Baptist Church (Orange) where she was endorsed and ordained as a Deaconess and would later become one of the "Mothers" of the Church.

Inez lived a long life and as such was preceded in death by all her siblings: Minnie, Walter, James and Lucille, her husband, Arthur Boseman, Sr. and her eldest child, Arthur Boseman, Jr. Above all, Inez Boseman loved God and raised her children to be followers of the Faith.

She leaves to cherish her memory: her son, Clarence (Andrea); her daughter, (Dr.) Gloria; five grandchildren, Sherrine Boseman-Rives (Todd) of Nigeria, Amon and Shumar of Carteret, Zinnar (Rose) of Linden and Breon Inez of Orange; twelve great-grandchildren, Dominick, Erin, Zachary, Lamar, Lanae, Shumon, Gyasa, Gyasia, Gyameir, Gyakeese, Gyashawn and Enelia; two great-great-grandchildren; a devoted daughter-in-love, Valerie Boseman of East Orange; nieces, Shirley; and great-nieces, Raissa Walker of Trenton and Airea Mathews (Emery) of Detroit, MI, niece, Yvonne Ikner of Orange; and Mary Lee McCloud of Anderson, IN "grandma" to Bari and Stephanie Noble, constant supporter, Tamara Mingo; and a host of other nieces, nephews, family and friends.
