### Reflections of Life

**Audrey J. Hinton**, daughter of the late Cleveland Gore and Cubie Stevens, was born on October 24th, 1937 in Galivants Ferry, South Carolina. On Saturday, January 21st, 2017, Audrey peacefully passed away at home in Paterson, NJ.

Audrey began her legacy as an activist for civil rights and equality in Conway, SC. As a child, she refused to pick cotton and tobacco despite her mother's instructions. Instead, young Audrey jumped off the back of the work truck, taking her siblings with her. Audrey attended Whittemore High School and later relocated to Paterson, NJ. She is remembered as a dedicated mother and highly involved parent. Audrey attending numerous school and sports events, while continuing her civic duties through community service. For several years, she devoted her time to making uniforms for the City of Paterson Junior Olympic teams and most recently, crocheting hundreds of scarfs and hats that were freely shared with the homeless, less fortunate, friends and family members. Audrey obtained her Bachelors degree in Sociology & Anthropology from William Paterson University. She served as a social worker for DYFS for over 25 years.

In addition, she was a lifetime member with the NAACP and held various leadership positions for several community groups. She also was an active member in many organizations including the Paterson Task Force for Community Action, AARP, and Zion Seniors of Calvary. Audrey was an avid traveler and enjoyed touring the world with family and friends. She approached her life with the hallmark of determination, boldness, and the spirit of generosity.

Audrey is preceded in death by her parents, Cleveland Gore and Cubie Stephens, her brother, George Gore, and son, L. Hal Carter.

She leaves cherished memories with her children: Tioasha Johnson of Hudson, NY, Rhonda Carter of Bear, DE, and Gary Carter (Lois Carter) of Clifton, NJ; her siblings: Famous "Francis" Gore (Lesile Gore) of Conway, SC, Doris Anthony of Paterson, NJ, Ann W.
