Bernard Issac "Duck" Davis, the third son of the late Mr. Thomas Davis and Mrs. Dorothy (Manigault) Davis was born on November 12, 1954 in Green Pond, South Carolina. He departed this life on Thursday, January 19, 2017 at his residence in Passaic, New Jersey.

Bernard attended the public school system of Paterson, namely School #18 and Eastside High School, from which he graduated in 1972. He graduated from Passaic County Community College in 1974.

At an early age, he attended Star of Hope Mission in downtown Paterson and frequented other religious homes throughout his life.

He loved to dress; becoming a well-loved paper boy to earn extra money, ensuring he stayed ahead of the fashion game. He was an avid sports fan, basketball (New York Knicks his favorite team) being his all-time favorite. He and his brothers, along with other "5th Ave Boys" would travel to different basketball courts in the city and in the surrounding areas, challenging all takers. He never gave up on life even as his health began to fail. He was a fixture of both the Passaic and Paterson communities. Although born in the South, he never quite lost his Southern drawl but he learned to embellish it with a Northeastern flare that was strictly his own.
