Hilda Johnson was born in Newark, NJ to the late Alma and William Curvin on July 2, 1930. She was called home January 24, 2017.

Hilda was predeceased by her husband of 47 years, Earl Leonard Johnson.

In youth, Hilda was baptized at Bethlehem Baptist Church, Newark, NJ, where she attended for many years. Later she joined Providence Baptist Church, Cliffwood, NJ Pastor Reverend Dr. Amelda Lee. Her church experience brought much joy.

Some years later, among the first group of women to become Toll Collectors in Essex County, Hilda worked for 25 years and retired from the New Jersey Garden State Parkway.

In 1955 Hilda married Earl L. Johnson "Skeets." They made their home in Newark, NJ for almost 40 years and had two children, Patricia and Henry. Hilda and Skeets retired to Cliffwood, NJ.

Dedicated to Civil Rights, alongside her husband, Hilda volunteered on numerous community issues. They worked tirelessly on projects to elect Kenneth A. Gibson, the first African American Mayor of Newark. She participated in the "March on Washington" and remained interested in matters of racial equality until her death.

A feisty little lady with a big heart and a big smile her passion was she loved and was deeply devoted to her family. She praised God through many challenges and illnesses. God was her strength. She felt blessed to spend her final years surrounded by love, living with her niece and great grand niece in Pennsylvania and later with her daughter in Matawan, NJ.
