**Lucy Rohilda Alexandria Crawford**, beloved mother, grandmother, great grandmother, great-grandmother, sister, aunt and mother-in-law, was born on April 23, 1922, in Kildonan Village, Berbice, in the then British Guiana, which later became Guyana.

'Ms. Lu or Aunty Lucy', as she was affectionately called by her family and friends, was not only the family's historian but also the village historian. She could remember and relate all events that took place and could also trace the family ancestry. With her exceptional memory, she was always willing to share her knowledge. Most importantly, she explained that she was fortunate to have met her great-great grandmother who was a slave brought from the West African country of Guinea, and was called Janett (name given to her by the slave masters); her real name being Cece Sabo. Everyone in the village came to Lucy to enquire about their ancestry and she was always able to give them details.

Aunty Lucy was a faithful woman of God, who loved and praised the Lord. She had an exceptional knowledge of the Bible and could explain it in detail and in simple terms for anyone to understand. She encouraged her children, grandchildren and her loved ones to serve the Lord. She served as a Sunday School Teacher in her Church at the Kildonan Scotts Church in Guyana.

When the First Black President of the United States, Mr. Barack Obama was elected, it was one of the proudest moments in her life. She got emotional and asked her daughter to come to her room to kneel since she couldn't have done it and she prayed fervently for him.

Ms. Lu was stern and truly the family's disciplinarian, as her children, and most of her nieces, nephews and cousins felt the 'heat of her hands'. They called her Ms. Put to Right. She respected time, was always punctual, and felt that if there is a stated time then, one should respect it. She would get upset if anyone was late.

Despite these traits, she had a wonderful humorous side. She was full of wisdom and shared wise sayings such as "the 'worst stick to befall a woman in her relationships is 'the Domestic' stick".

Ms. Lu lived in Mackenzie, the bauxite mining town in Guyana, where she worked as a nanny for the then Demerara Bauxite Company (DEMBA) staff. She later studied cosmetology and became a hairstylist.

Lucy was married to the now deceased Mr. Clive Crawford. In the final days, she suffered with Alzheimer's disease and though her speech left her, she could communicate effectively by singing her favorite hymns and repeating the Lord's Prayer.

Left to mourn the loss of Lucy are her loving children: Bernadette, Diane and Janette. Grandchildren: Dylon, Dionne, Lugard, Pharez and Jarrett. Great-Grand Mother of Joshua, Aliya, Zabrina, Alexa, Ayanna and Delia. Great-Great Grandchild: Kayla. Mother-in-Law of David and William. Grand Mother-in-Law of Alex and Leah. Sister of Eula and Winston of London, the United Kingdom, and Janette (Dolly) of Guyana.
