

Obsequies

John Crayton, Jr. was born in Jersey City, N.J. on June 4, 1933 to the late St. John and Etta (nee: Whitehurst) Crayton. John was the eldest of six children, Shirley Ann Pinkney, (deceased); Leroy Crayton (deceased); Dolores Shaw; James Francis Crayton; and, Grant Levy Crayton.


