#### <u>Obituary</u>

**Ruth Elizabeth Dean-Harraway** affectionately known by family and close friends as "**Dee-Dee**" was born to her late father, Leon Thomas and surviving mother, Ruth Thomas in Bridgeport, Connecticut on October 19, 1943. She was the third oldest of seven siblings, preceding her youngest sibling and sister, Charlene Thomas who made her transition in June 2013.

The family was moved and raised by their parents in the Patterson Houses located in the Bronx, New York. During Ruth's teenage years, it has been well documented in the family annals of her precocious behavior and how she continually tested the patience of her mother. Being strong willed, she would repeatedly get in trouble for staying out after curfew, preferring to take her whipping (yes, you could beat kids back then) as long as those nights were filled with fun and adventure with her lifelong best friend, Sandra Adams along with others.

She was educated in the New York City Public School System and upon meeting her future husband, Lorenzo Dean, who also grew up in the Patterson Houses they eventually married and bore children. After his death, Ruth dedicated her life to her children. She was employed at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital and then took a position at Maritime Overseas Corporation leaving after several years to continue her education, earning a Degree from Monroe College.

Ruth eventually met the second love of her life James "Jimmy" Harraway as she remarried and they were together for 28 years until he made his transition in July 2009. During their union, she returned to Columbia Presbyterian Hospital as a Blood Data Entry Specialist where she worked for the past two decades with her beloved colleagues and co-workers building an extraordinary bond that was evident when she got sick. They were at the hospital often to offer their love and support after it was discovered she was afflicted with a terminal illness.

Many people described Ruth as an Angel on Earth, an adoring soul who was beautiful, insightful, intelligent, kind and compassionate. She was very spiritual and embodied the essence of God. As she lay in the hospital bed weakened from the disease, she would listen to her children's conversations who kept a vigil at her bedside and would smile, because she knew for certain she was loved and would soon be going Home to the Kingdom of the Lord.

On Thursday, January 26, 2017, God summoned her home and we are all thankful that we had a chance to be in the presence of an Angel.
