Obituary

Leo Dozier, son of the late Cordelia and Daniel Dozier, Sr., was born on September 23, 1940 in Mobile, Alabama. He was the oldest child of eleven children. In his younger years, Leo attended Mobile County Training School, where he played three sports: football--both ways, offense left back (running back) and defense (defensive safety), baseball (center fielder) and track. Leo excelled in these three sports and he still holds sports records in the state of Alabama. He was also a contender for the Olympics.

Leo attended Texas College for two years and after they cut the athletic program he transferred to Texas Southern University. Shortly after, he joined the Army. He served in the Army for six years and during this time he traveled and played football. Once he was assigned to the 1st Air Calvary Division he was sent to Vietnam for combat and special assignment in the Vietnam War. He was in Vietnam for approximately three years and because of his agent orange exposure he was honorably discharged with a rank of Staff Sergeant (SSG). Leo was an exceptional football player and was asked to try out for the Chicago Bears and was chosen to join the team. During this time, he injured his knee and because he had to pay for his own treatment he could not pursue this opportunity.

While still in the Army and home in Alabama on leave, Leo met his soul mate, Louvinia Williams through his cousin. After he was discharged, they were married on September 12, 1967. In 1969, Leo and Louvinia moved to Westbury, New York where they built a new life. They lived in Westbury for 38 years and raised seven children. Leo worked at the United States Post Office and retired after 36 years of service. With his military time his total years of public service with the government was 41 years. In 2007, Leo and Louvinia decided to embark on a new journey and moved to Townsend, Delaware. In 2013, his loving wife, Louvinia departed this life and he was left to cherish her memory. On February 2, 2017, Leo departed this life and they are now reunited again.

Leo leaves to cherish his memory: seven children, Yusuf Hasan of Bronx, NY, Laura Charles (Samuel) of Westbury, NY, Alfred Williams of Jericho, NY, Lynette Smith (James) of Dinwiddie, VA, Vincent Williams, Sr. (Kimberly) of Stone Mountain, GA, Cordelia Bostic of Townsend, DE, and Carolyn Dozier of Wilmington, DE. Leo leaves behind six grandchildren, Gerard Charles (Erika), Monique Charles, Michael Williams, Krystal Charles, Vincent Williams, Jr., and Jazmine Young. Leo was proud of his five great-grandchildren, Courtney, Darius, Jayden, Alexis and Adrienne. Two of Leo's siblings preceded him in death, George Dozier and David Dozier; leaving to mourn nine siblings, Daniel Dozier, Jr. (Maggie) of Brewton, Al, Etta (Theresa) Robinson of Daphne, AL, Jean Dozier (Ursula) of Hephzibah, GA, Arthur Dozier (Sandra) of Freeport, NY, Anderson Dozier (Iris) of Wantagh, NY, James Dozier (Deborah) of Jacksonville, FL, Mary Dozier of Mobile, AL, Sharon Dozier of Mobile, AL and Daisy Allen of Prichard, AL.
