Maria would always have conversations about how gifted Arthur was, and she would say “there is nothing my husband cannot do”. Maria truly felt it, and many times said to her children “I feel daddy can make a man, but the only problem that we would have is that he wouldn’t be able to breathe life into it”.

Arthur leaves behind his amazing mother Gloria Maynard, wonderful wife Maria, his three children Quentin, Kerry and Tiffany, three grandchildren Quentin Jr., Elijah and Cameron, a beautiful goddaughter Olivia Worrell, twelve siblings, nine nieces, five nephews and eight wonderful cousins who he loved dearly.
