Reflections of Life

Eugene Jackson (Gene) was born in Saddle River NJ February 10, 1925. He resided in Paterson, NJ since 1939.

He was a member of Our Lady Of Victories Church, Martin Luther King Judo Club (Black Belt), Koda Kan International Federation.

Eugene was an Army veteran of World War II where he service active duty in the battle of Normandy Northern France, decorated with Europeen African Middle Eastern Service Victory Medal.

Eugene's hobbies were art, music, and poetry. He was also manager of His nephew Ron Foster's musical R&B GROUP in the late 1960s which included Gene's son Eugene on guitar. Gene (the Father) also played Hawaiian guitar and piano himself.

Eugene had a quiet life with his wife Mildred but was strong-willed and Very vocal about what he felt was right or wrong.

He actively demonstrated a strong commitment to civil rights movements in the 60s and led several protests with some of the local Teens and adults in the Paterson area during those troubled and segregated times.

Mother- Grace Jackson (7th child in family of 13) – all deceased, Wife – Mildred (Foster) Jackson-deceased, Son – Eugene A. Jackson – pre-deceased his parents, Grandson-Bryant Crockett (Paterson, NJ) who has four children, Great-grand-children- Hezekiah, Arissa, Bryana, and Autumn, Siblings-Ethel (Chick) Jackson/Franklin-Paterson, NJ-deceased, Harold Jackson-Brooklyn, NY-deceased, Henrietta (Tubby) Jackson/McKoy-Paterson, NJ – deceased, Raymond (Pug) Jackson-Paterson, NJ -deceased, cousins- 5 living from a total of 38, Christina Bellamy (White Plains, NY), Eleanor Capers, Sylvia, Jackson, Sandy Jackson, and Marjorie Scott. Eugene has a host of nephews, nieces, and other relatives and friends.

Ronald A. Foster (Gene's nephew) was caregiver for Eugene for many years before Eugene and his wife Mildred became too big of a burden and thus spent the remaining years of their lives at the Veterans Home of Paramus, New Jersey. The nurses and staff at this facility took very Good care of the both of them right up until their transitioning.

I would like to thank Christina Bellamy (Gene's cousin) for her help in Obtaining much of this information contained in the relationship search. In one of Gene's collection of short writings I found this quote: "Help me be a good sport in the game of life".
