<u>Obituary</u>

Charles Lee Chappell, 89, departed this life on Monday, February 13, 2017, at home in his bed with his daughter by his side.

In the 1990's, Charles and Dorothy adopted a newborn baby girl as their child together, named Sparkle. Charles and Dorothy was united in marriage until Dorothy's death in 2014.

Charles was educated at Peabody High School where he received his high school diploma. He was a member, and was baptized at Bethany Baptist Church in Petersburg, Virginia.
