Obituary

At least once a month she would surprise him by showing up at his school with snacks and drinks for everyone in his class. Her granddaughter, Treasure always requested her grandma to make one of her favorite dishes, "Macaroni and Cheese."

In 2016, her dad's health began to fail so Renee decided to come back to NJ to help take care of him. Renee counted it a pleasure to assist with taking care of her dad; she really enjoyed cooking his favorite meals. She was an awesome cook and enjoyed doing it. While in New Jersey she would spend time with her son Derrick and daughter in law Monica; she started attending church with them and loved it. She accepted the Lord as her Savior, and her lifestyle began to change. Renee became a faithful member of Immanuel Love Fellowship Center Church. She assisted in flea markets, prepared meal, she even visited the sick with her "BFF" Mary Moye; she was always willing to lend a helping hand.

In August 2016, while her dad was in the hospital, Renee was asked to cook at "Joe Cometh in the Morning Social Adult Daycare" for a month to help out; they loved her and her cooking so much they asked her to stay; she loved cooking and serving the clients and they loved her.

On February 16, 2017, Renee took ill and was rushed to the hospital where she fought for her life until February 21, 2017, as she realized that her Heavenly Father needed more.
