Obituary

Lillie Loving was born on November 17, 1942 to Ms. Mary Loving Fleming. She was the first of Mary's four children; Lillie is survived by her siblings James, Howard, and Rosa. She spent her childhood in Charlottesville, VA and graduated from Jackson P. Burley High School in 1961.

She gave birth to her son, Philip, and then moved to New Jersey. She made her way to Newark, NJ where she attended Rutgers University, earning a degree in Psychology. She also earned a degree in phlebotomy and worked in the lab at St. Michael's Hospital in Newark, NJ for over 20 years. She worked at Orange Memorial Hospital in Orange, NJ and with Dr. Atkins in his lab in NYC.

In April of 1973 she gave birth to her son, Sean, whom she lived with. Lillie retired in 2007, to help take care of her grandsons. Besides spoiling them, she made them breakfast, took them to the Burlington Waterfront to ride their bikes, rode the NJ River Line train to Trenton and back, introduced them to scratch-off lottery tickets, and would just happen to find something to buy them at ToysRUs. During the school year she would drive them to and from school, and then to their Jiu Jitsu lessons or football or wrestling practice.

December of 2015, Lillie was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. She fought courageously and was called Home on Tuesday, February 28, 2017.
