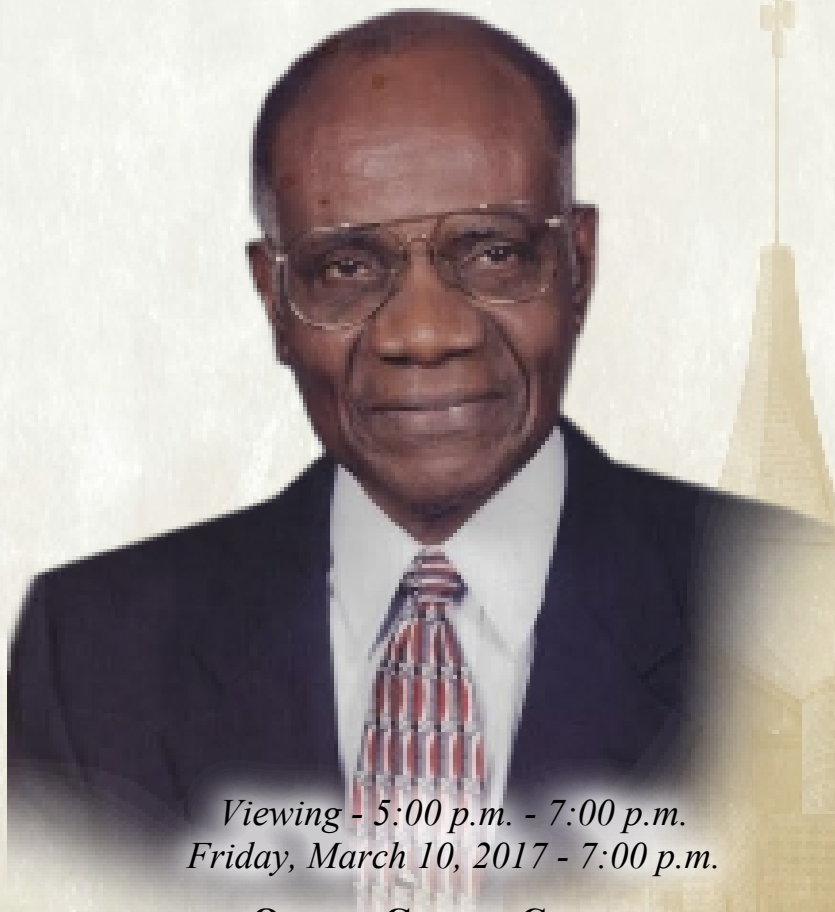

Eulogy

Lloyd Otto Bewry was born on June 20, 1924 to Sarah and Ernest Bewry in Ocho Rios, Jamaica, W.I. He was the third of five children in a happy, closely knit and well respected family in their community. Lloyd wanted to be a doctor but that dream came to a sudden halt at the early demise of his father. However, he entered into a life of service to others at an early age.

As a teen, he joined the Royal Air Force and was deployed to Europe. He was a part of the Radar Operations Team in World War II and studied Radio Communications while in England. When Lloyd returned to Jamaica he worked as a Survey Draftsman and married the Cuban “green-eyed” beauty, Maud Evans.

Lloyd had accepted the Lord as his personal savior prior to marrying Maud and they were soon called into fulltime service with the Associated Gospel Assemblies. Lloyd left his Civil Service job in Kingston and went to Clarendon to serve as Pastor at the Kemps Hill Gospel Church. He was instrumental in opening multiple other churches in Clarendon, Jamaica. Their involvement in community needs was limitless.

After many years of waiting, Lloyd and Maud were blessed with four beautiful daughters, after having lost their first child before birth and later their last child, both boys. They were eventually called to return to Kingston and the Duhaney Park Gospel Church was opened under their ministry. With the Lord’s help and guidance, the success of that fellowship had to do with the door-to-door service they gave to that community and the undiluted word proclaimed. Rev. Bewry was also able to engage in his craft as an architectural draftsman to subsidize his salary.

During his pastorate at Duhaney Park, Rev. Bewry attended the Jamaica Theological Seminary where he obtained his BA in Theology. He served as Chaplain for many schools, including Girls Town, Jamaica and he sat on many boards. As a member of the

Executive Board of the AGA Churches, he served in various roles, but felt most fulfilled as the Youth Representative.

The family was led to relocate to the United States during the early 1970s. Soon after their arrival in New York, Rev. Bewry was called to be the Pastor of the Olivet Gospel Church.

Rev. Bewry's service to the Olivet Community was seasoned with love and dedication as demonstrated in his other ministries. He served on the Police Clergy Coalition (an organization that gave scholarships to College bound students, as well as being involved in improving the safety of the Bronx). Under his leadership, the Olivet Gospel Church sponsored many health fairs, open air meetings, car washes, food distributions, clothing distributions, tract distributions and visitation programs in the Bronx. Rev. Bewry also lead a missionary team back to Jamaica, W.I. where many services were provided to several communities.

In May 1990, his beloved Maud went home to be with the Lord. In 1998, he retired and married Rita Kongwa and they relocated to Florida. Later, when Rev. Bewry's health began to deteriorate, he returned to New York where his daughters assumed responsibility for his care.

Early Monday morning February 20, 2017, Rev. Bewry, while peacefully sleeping, went home to be with his Savior. His daughter Sharon was sitting next to him.

Rev. Bewry leaves to mourn daughters, Dorothea, Sharon, Faith and Grace; grandchildren, Ricardo, Kariche, Patrina, Dan Asher, Christina Maud and Brandon; great grandchildren, J'Hanelle, Latrel, Anthony, Alexandra, Gabriella, Michael and Julian; sisters, Mavis, Elise and Varlo and a host of other relatives and friends.

We know you are resting in peace Dad!
