She departed this life and entered eternal rest peacefully on March 4th, 2017. Marzetta Miller was converted to Christianity at an early age and attended Piney Grove Baptist Church in Halesburg, Alabama. During her lifetime, Marzetta was educated in North Carolina School Systems. 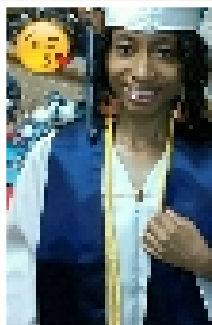
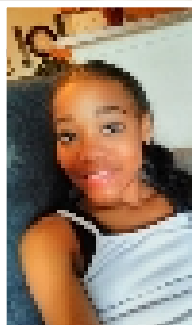
