Janet Louise Brown was born on April 21, 1951 to the late Elroy Brown and to Evelyn Williams Brown in Charlottesville, Virginia and grew up in Faber, Virginia. Janet and her siblings were among the first students to integrate the Nelson County School District.

Janet developed a strong work ethic in the sizeable family gardens, where tasks included tending fruit trees and taking care of livestock. By the age of ten, and with the support of her stepmother, Ethelene Brown, Janet learned to cook meals for her large family on a wood-burning stove, from scratch. The oldest of six children, Janet cultivated a sense of responsibility in caring for others alongside her grandfather, Floyd, while her parents worked.

At Nelson County High School, Janet was a member of the school choir and Future Homemakers of America. She loved playing softball with her family and friends. Janet gave her life to the Lord as a child. She enjoyed singing in the Cedar Grove Baptist Church choir in Faber, Virginia. Summers as a teenager were spent working on a tobacco farm in Connecticut in order to save money for her school clothes and supplies. In her spare time, Janet loved to read.

After graduating from high school, Janet moved to East Orange, New Jersey to work in her Aunt Nell's dry cleaner. It was there that she met a patron, the late Robert William Curry of East Orange. Reverend Dr. Theodore Jenkins, Robert's uncle, married them on June 24, 1972 at Macedonia Christian Church in Vauxhall, New Jersey. To this union, six children were born: Kevin Robert, Kimberly Apryl, Robyn Denise, Michael David, Mark Jason, and Hillary Danielle.

After many years as a dedicated homemaker, ensuring her children had the best start in life, Janet re-entered the workforce as a paraprofessional in the East Orange School District, once Hillary was a first-grader. Already an active PTA member, Janet established meaningful relationships with students, teachers, and administrators, for more than fifteen years as part of the staff at Dionne Warwick Institute (Lincoln), Whitney Houston Elementary School (Franklin), and George Washington Carver (Columbian) Elementary School. Janet's love for children shined brightly on everyone, including the many friends of her children. Affectionately known as "Mom Curry," Janet was recognized by many as a community mother for her sweet spirit and generosity.

Janet faithfully served New Hope Baptist Church in East Orange, New Jersey through many ministries over the years, including the Deaconess Board, Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Hospitality Committee, Food Pantry, and many more. She always put the needs of others ahead of her own. Janet's strong relationship with the Lord allowed her to lovingly serve others all of her life.
