Beulah Hilton Scott was born on August 28, 1922 in Manning, South Carolina to Lily Mack Hilton and Wheeler Hilton. After her mother passed, Wheeler married Marie Ranton Hilton, who was the only mother she knew.

She accepted Christ at a very young age and joined Union Cypress African Methodist Episcopal Church in Manning, South Carolina. She was a graduate of the Santee Rosenwall School in Manning, South Carolina. She relocated to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and then to Hallendale, Florida where she met and married the late Alex Scott in 1946. To this union two children were born; the late Alex Scott, Jr. and one daughter.

After relocating to Paterson, New Jersey, she joined the First African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church where she served as a faithful Deaconess, member of the Altar Guild, and a Zion Senior.
