They called her mom and she adopted them as her children. Rillie was always willing to listen, console, and offer spiritual advice to her family and friends. "TRUST GOD" and "THE LORD WILL PROVIDE AND MAKE A WAY" were beliefs that she lived by. Rillie enjoyed spending time with her grandchildren whom she loved dearly. But most of all, she loved just being with her beloved Sam. They spent their time together talking, cooking, fishing, praying, watching TV, singing and cheering the Mets. They were true soulmates.
