Curry Donar Jr. was born in Bristol, Florida on June 19, 1944 to the late Curry Donar Sr. and Evelyn (Floyd) Donar and attended Rosenwald High School in Panama City, FL. He proudly served the US Army; toured in Vietnam; awarded a National Defense Service Medal, Overseas Service Bar, and a Vietnam Campaign Medal with device (1960). After serving, Curry moved to New Jersey and married his high school sweetheart, Cora Lee Harris in February 1967. In December 1969 the couple gave birth to their daughter, Pamela Denise Donar.

Curry started his career with the NJ United States Postal Service as a mail carrier and retired as a Supervisor. During his career at the post office he also managed the Employee Assistance Program and Credit Union. Curry was so passionate about travel, he and his wife started New Millennium Travel Agency after retiring. Over the years Curry has traveled to every continent and visited over 50 countries.

Curry was a gregarious person who could strike up a conversation with absolutely anyone. He was proud of his 46 year sobriety and being a friend and sponsor in Alcoholics Anonymous.

He will always be cherished by his beloved wife, Cora Donar (Panama City, FL/Roselle, NJ); daughter, Pamela Donar (Bournemouth, England); sister, Zola Mae Williams (Denver, CO); and sisters-in-law, Elizabeth Donar (Hartford, CT), Dorothy Donar (Hartford, CT), and Dorothy Donar (Panama City, FL).
