JEROME WOODWARD

Jerome Woodward is a product of Newark, New Jersey, born and raised in the Ironbound Section, more commonly known as "Down Neck", with five brothers and three sisters.

He was preceded in death by his parents Theodore Woodward and Carrie Snyder Woodward.

Jerome attended the Newark Public School system, graduating from Essex County Vocational and Technical High School as a Cabinet Maker. He also attended Essex County College as a Business Major and Middlesex County College for job related courses.

Jerome's working career of twenty-six years at E.I. DuPont & Co., Inc. at the Newark Colored Pigment Plant consisted of sixteen years in Management as a Production Supervisor, the Employee Relations Department as a Labor Relations Specialist, and Raw Material Receiving Supervisor, taking Disability Retirement in 1989.

Jerome's Church Affiliation is with the St. James A.M.E. Church in Newark, where he is a sixty years plus member, and he sang on The Cathedral Choir.

Jerome served in the United States Army from December 1960 thru December 1962. Part of his time of active duty was served in Europe, Germany.

Jerome's Masonic Career began in December 1974 as a Member of Hiram Lodge No. 4. After serving in two stations, he was elected Worshipful Master. Moving through the Red House he ultimately served as Most Excellent High Priest of Haggai Royal Arch Chapter No. 2, and went on to become Most Excellent Grand High Priest of Hiram Royal Arch Chapter. He also served as Secretary of Hiram Commandry No. 17 Knights Templar as a Member of Morocco Temple No. 1 A.A.O.N.M.S, he served as Second Ceremonial Master. He is a Past Commander-In-Chief of Mohaab Grand Consistory.

Brother Woodward has also served as Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons for the Most Worshipful King William Grand Lodge A.F.&A.M. Jurisdiction for five years. He served as Honorary Eminent Commander of Hiram Commandry, and Honorary Potentate of Morocco Temple No. 1.

Bro. Woodward was made a Thirty-Third Degree Inspector General in 1986, and for six years he served as President of the Inter-Fraternal Masonic Relations Commission of New Jersey.

On a National level, he has served as Grand Master General of Ceremonies for the United Supreme Council of The Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite for the thirty-third and last

Degree of Freemasonry; for the Southern and Western Masonic Jurisdiction - U.S.A. Grant Orient, Washington, D.C.

He served as Chairman and Co-Chairman of the Masonic Education Committee, for the General Grand Masonic Congress for ten plus years and served two terms as 1st Vice President, and three terms as President of the General Grand Masonic Congress.

Brother Woodward's Masonic Philosophy is: "Wear one hat at a time, and prepare yourself to bring something to the table for the hat you are wearing".

Brother Woodward said all of his accomplishments "are the result of much prayer, faith, and trust in our Lord and Savior, which proves once again, that through Christ all things are possible".

Jerome was preceded in death by his brothers, Theodore Woodward, Thomas Woodward, James Woodward and Edwin Woodward, and his sisters, Elizabeth Williams and Mary Susan Ward.

Left to mourn his beloved wife, Shirley L. Woodward; his children, Jerome Clayton Woodward (Myree), Jared Charles Woodward, Jason Corey Woodward, Barry Michaelton Grant, Darryl Roderick Grant (Brigette), Karyn Michaele Grant-Neal (Marc). Together they have nineteen grandchildren and thirteen and a half great grandchildren; his sister, Adie Schenck and a host of nieces, nephews, including Reverend Carton Woodward and his wife, Rev. Blanche Woodward and other cousins.


Broken Chain
