In 2012, she moved from Harlem, NY to Rahway, New Jersey close to her daughter, Sheila Shockley but she always went back to her old neighborhood or "around the Block" as we would call it. She had so much love for the people of 131st Street and would try to attend the yearly 131st block parties with her children. Julia loved her children and grandchildren but she especially love her sons and they truly loved and cherished her until the end. Before the end of her life she gave her life to Christ and accepted him as her Lord and Savior.

She departed this life on April 6, 2017 at highlands Care one Rehab and Nursing Home after a short illness.


She was predeceased in death by her companion, Chauncey Alston and two daughters, Matilda Morris and Beverly and her brother, Theodore Morris Jr.
