Robert E. Stephens

Early Years

Robert E. Stephens (Bob) of North Brunswick was born on August 5, 1940 to Charlie G. and Marietta Stephens of Spartanburg County South Carolina. He entered his eternal rest on April 28, 2017. He graduated from New Bethel High School(Now Woodruff High School) in 1958 and then matriculated to Johnson C Smith graduating in 1963 earning a Bachelor degree in Social Science and Economics. His first job out of college was as an Economics teacher at Georgetown High School in Jacksonville, NC. August of 1965 was a special time for Robert. Not only did he begin a new job with Hercules Chemical Co., he also married his childhood friend and love of his life, Wilma Pearson. Two years later, Robert and Wilma would make the decision to relocate to Newark, New Jersey where he was able to put his education to use by working for the Essex County Welfare Board in 1967.

Family

In October 1970, Robert and Wilma expanded their family by adding a bouncing baby boy, Marcus I. Stephens(Marc). Three years later, The Stephens Family would move from their apartment in Newark, NJ and settle into their first house in the progressive suburb of Hillside, NJ. Robert and Wilma only had one child however, the memories that they created would sustain them for a lifetime. Although Robert had one child, he established relationships with young boys and girls, men and women that resulted in him being a surrogate parent to many.

Career

In the fall of 1973, in a bold move, Robert took an educational sabbatical from The Essex County Welfare Board to attend Rutgers University in New Brunswick where he graduated with a Masters of Social Work degree that was completed in May of 1974. Upon completion of an internship with the New Jersey Department of Corrections, he was chosen to head the Newark House Program in 1975, the only adult male half-way house facility, operated by the New Jersey Department of Corrections. Due to his relentless work ethic, in early 1982, Robert, a young, rising talent in The Department of Correctional Facility. Two years later in 1984, Robert was promoted from Assistant Superintendent to Superintendent where he served until 1986. In 1986, Robert was hand-selected to run a brand new, state of the art facility, located in Newark New Jersey called Northern State Correctional Facility.

While there, Robert created many jobs and opportunities for the residents of Newark and surrounding areas, as well as mentored and counseled many individuals as they traversed their respective careers. His tenure there lasted until 1993. In July of 1993, another promotional opportunity knocked. He was promoted to the roll of Deputy Director of The Department of Corrections. His new position gave him oversight for three institutions. Just as he thought that his career had peaked, in 1994, he received yet another promotion. Serving, at the time, as the highest ranking Black person in the department, in the capacity of Director of the Division of Operations, providing oversight over Chaplaincy Services, Youth Boot Camp and the Academy and Staff Training. He enjoyed a well-deserved retirement in 1999 after a successful 32-year career.

Church

Robert accepted The Lord as his personal savior at an early age. He was a dedicated and active member of Clear View Baptist Church for 43 years. He was a member and longtime Chairman of the Trustee Board, using his leadership skills to lead the church through good and unsettling times. Robert utilized his former teaching experience to teach Sunday School, as well as new members at Clear View. In May 1992, Robert reached the pinnacle of his layman calling, as he was ordained as a Deacon and worked diligently in "...His father's vineyard". Robert also had a special affinity working with the men of Clear View and the youth, serving on the Scholarship committee. He also served on many other committees and Boards.

Service

Throughout his lifetime, Robert was committed to the self-less act of serving others through many avenues. While attending Johnson C. Smith University, Robert was initiated as a brother of the Rho Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. He also dedicated his life and time to The Orange-East Orange Optimist Club, in 2015, Robert received the O.A.R (Offender Aid and Restoration) Lifetime Achievement Award for his dedication to healthy re-entry of former inmates into society. He also served on many boards of Professional organizations, such as, the Board of Trustees of the Middle Atlantic Correctional Association, a member of the Board of the North American Association of Wardens/Superintendents and a member of the National Black Law Enforcement Executives. Robert leaves to mourn, his wife of 53 years, Wilma Stephens. His son and daughter-in-law, Marcus and Helen Stephens. His two Grandchildren, Summer and Miles, who were his pride and joy.

He is survived by his Aunt Bernice Good and Aunt, The Rev. Deborah Williams and her husband Bennie Williams. A host of Cousins, nieces and nephews and especially, his Brothers and Sister, Alar Higgins (Letha), Lewis Stephens (Katherine), Nadine Smith and Fred Stephens (Mary). He has joined in Glory his Mother and Father, Charlie and Marietta Stephens, and Brothers Percy (Lilly Ruth), Grover and his Eldest sister, Queenie.
