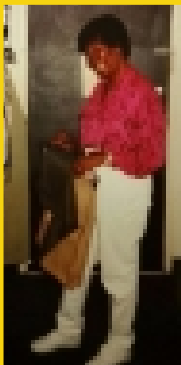
Inez had a passion for cooking gourmet meals. Her specialty was German Chocolate Cake, she also loved to sew, knit, and crochet.
