Alice D. Frost was born on March 22, 1940 in Wilmington, North Carolina to the proud parents, Willie Frost and Geneva B. Frost.

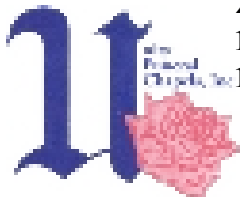

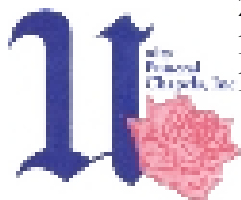
