

<u>Obituary</u>

Lloyd Farmer, 56, died May 28, 2017, with his family by his side at the Father Hudson, Center for Hope Hospice of Elizabeth, New Jersey.

Lloyd Farmer's, life's story began on March 19, 1961 in Newark, New Jersey to his father, Mr. Load Farmer and his mother, the late Mrs. Velez McDonald Farmer. Lloyd, who has been called "Stinker," since childhood, was an amazing son, brother, uncle, and friend. Despite his congenital developmental and physical handicap, he was an insightful humorous man, who was well-loved, cherished, and well cared for by his family. His parents ensured that Lloyd receive resources and supportive services that equipped him with strengths that enhanced his disabilities and empowered him to be somewhat self sufficient, and verbally expressive. Lloyd had been a resident of the North Jersey Developmental Center of Totowa, NJ and after its closing he moved into a community setting with the ARC of Essex County located in Livingston, NJ. Lloyd really bonded with the staff at the ARC OF Essex where they provided attentive care and enabled him to become socially poised. He was musically inclined and enjoyed listening to classical, pop, and rhythm & blues music from LP albums that he played on his record player. His main interests were spending quality time with his parents, siblings, in-laws, nieces, & nephews. Lloyd was a blessing to others because he showed leadership, patience, and forgiveness to those who mimicked his disability and would say to his siblings that those who mocked him, had no understanding about his condition.

We thank the staffs of the ARC of Essex and the Center for Hope Hospice for the loving and attentive care that they both provided to Lloyd. This story continues until we see our Lloyd & our Stinker again, who we dearly love and will always miss.
