

The Life of John L. Toler, Jr.

John Lee Toler, Jr. was born April 29, 1938 in Newark, NJ; the first born of 9 sons and 3 daughters to the late Rev. John L. Toler, Sr. and Mary Alice Toler. He transitioned on June 1, 2017 in Newark, NJ. John was a precocious child who was an able and very hard working student graduating from Barringer High School in 1956 where he was a standout Track & Field athlete and played the violin.

John was a progressive young man who taught his brothers how to make money by simonizing and detailing cars. As a teenager, John worked for the Humpty Dumpty Diner and along with his brothers took orders for the Allen Cake Box Baker of Elizabeth, NJ, delivering items on Saturday's.

John loved Straight Ahead Jazz and often visited New York's Greenwich Village which nurtured his individualism and progressive, independent thought. Miles Davis, Art Blakely and Tito Puente were among his favorite artists. After chauffeuring the Chairman of Ronson Corporation, John enlisted in the United States Army where he was stationed in Sweden and Germany. There, he became fluent in both languages.

John had the gift of gab, superior intellect, and a tremendous vocabulary. These qualities enabled him to initiate and accomplish many projects and ventures thought by others to be impossible. Not to be deterred, John was straight ahead in his unparalleled drive and ambition. An eternal optimist, he believed he could accomplish the impossible. He was truly an independent spirit.

John was also a health enthusiast and a believer in raw foods, exercise and clean living; never smoking anything or indulging in alcohol. He was as strong as a bull and would share and encourage others to follow his example of clean living.

John attended Jersey City State College and subsequently enlisted in the United States Army earning an Honorable Discharge. He settled in Sweden where he owned and operated Toler's Bakery for 10 years; a thriving business with several trucks that delivered its products to the Stockholm area.

John would return to Newark, New Jersey in 1971 where he found a different culture climate than the one he'd left in the 1950s. Black was beautiful, the Afro was in and Muhammad Ali was "The Greatest." In a sense, it took a while for him to adjust to the changed community fervor.

John would run an innovative "Kiddie Disco" in Newark and became a freelance consultant to area businesses. Throughout his life, his family supported his endeavors; always deferring to his opinions and efforts at developing businesses, hosting events and generally being a real go-getter.

Despite his holistic practices, John developed several serious ailments that he ultimately succumbed to. John was predeceased by his brothers Kenneth and Gilbert, and his sisters Myrna and Karen. John is survived by 7 siblings: Richard, David, Norman, Anita, Calvin, Darrell & Kevin, sisters-in-law: Rose, Blanca and Judy, brother-in-law: Morris Wynn, and more than 100 nieces and nephews that will cherish his memory forever.
