#### <u>Obituary</u>

Ronald truly believed the mantra "Once a Marine, always a Marine", and he remained active in the Brooklyn Marine Corps League until his passing. Ronald was employed by several parking garages over the years, but most recently he was employed as a Supervisor at ParkLex Parking Systems, in New York City.

Ronald joined "Christian Cultural Center" (CCC) in 1995 under the leadership of AR Bernard. He accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as his Saviour and was baptized. He attended CCC faithfully until he became too ill to travel. He truly appreciated the teachings of Pastor Bernard.

Ronald was a sharp dresser, he took great pride in his appearance and liked his cars luxurious and clean. The people that he loved were incredibly blessed, as he was the type of person that would always be there for you. Though he had a tough exterior he was one of the nicest people that you could ever meet. Ronald was very loving and caring and would do anything in his power to help you.
