
CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF Barney E. Richardson, Jr.

Obituary

Deacon Barney Early Richardson Jr. entered into eternal life at the Brakely Park Nursing Home in Phillipsburg, NJ on Saturday, July 22, 2017 at 8:15pm. He resided in Bloomsbury, NJ.

He was one of twelve children born in Darlington County, South Carolina to the late Barney Richardson, Sr. and Maude Boseman Richardson.

His educational career began in the public schools of Hartsville, South Carolina where he graduated from Butler High School. After High School Barney was drafted into the U.S. Army. After his release from the Army, he attended and graduated from North Carolina Central University, Durham, North Carolina with a Bachelors Degree in Science and Biology. After graduation, Barney re-enlisted into the U.S. Army a second time. Later on thru the years he began a Graduate/Masters program at Rutgers University in Newark, NJ, thru the Elizabeth Board of Education. He changed his mind and enrolled in Essex County College in Newark, NJ where he received a Fireman's/Black Seal license in 1976

Barney's career with the Manhattan Transit Authority, NYC spanned over 40 years and his career with the Elizabeth Board of Education was over 10 years.

In addition, he was a devoted and loving husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend.

He was dedicated to his church, Unity Baptist Church in Orange, NJ where he served on many boards and auxiliaries until his health began to fail.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his loving wife, Jearlean Richardson, his son, Tony Hubert, six sisters: Dorothy Boseman, Pagonia Thomas, Emmie Smith, Laura Allen, Vernetta Dixon and Carrie Johnson, four brothers: Bill Richardson, Norris Richardson, Purvis Richardson and Burree Richardson.
