Vivian's people skills allowed her to negotiate a Management position at the Central Lounge on 161st Street and Morris Avenue. Vivian oversaw food services at the Lounge. People would come from near and far to eat her cooking. Her hospitality and charisma kept consumers coming back for years. The Central Lounge was also where Vivian met her late husband, Larry Butler.

In her mid-seventies, Vivian was baptized and gave her life to the Lord as an active member of Unity Baptist Church on Courtland Avenue in the Bronx. Through faith and blessings, Vivian was able to overcome cancer once in her 80's, and again in her 90's. The Lord blessed Vivian with strength, courage, and a lot of love.

Vivian's hobbies were hosting family gatherings, wearing the latest fashions, dancing, and traveling the world by cruise. She loved to make people smile and enjoyed a good laugh. Vivian was called to the Lord at the age of 97.
