Her dedication to the students and staff, as a volunteer, in Public School 1 led to her being offered a position as a School Aide and later as an Assistant Teacher. While serving as a School Aide the Principal of Public School 1, Phillip Moran, chose Geraldine to attend a program at Pace University. Geraldine graduated from Pace University, with honors, earning an Applied Science degree in Communications Technology. During the time of her studies at Pace University she reunited with and married her long lost childhood sweetheart, Joseph William "Billy Joe" Metoyer. The two spent several blissful years together before Billy Joe succumbed to illness.
