Trevor, as he was mostly known, attended public schools through graduation from the prestigious Bronx High School of Science in 1949. Upon graduation he entered Brooklyn College and after two years began his career in the insurance industry at Consolidated Mutual.

One of his great loves, basketball, didn't prove to be a potential career path but he could hold his own in any conversation about anything related to not only basketball but most of the popular sports. He also experienced the Harlem of Langston Hughes, Zora Neale Hurston, Malcom X, and a musical genre that would influence and inspire him until his final days.....Jazz.Very early on he developed a captivating charm and polished style which he shared with his fellow Les Garcons Club members.

Sports, Jazz and his third big love was pretty obvious to him when he was introduced to his future wife, Shirley Medford. Shirley shared his passion for music, action and style. The two married after an exciting courtship and their ceremony was a social event featured in the Amsterdam News.

The activism and political scene of the 60's and 70's influenced Trevor to leave the conventional 9 to 5 behind and he entered into a more nonconventional career; which was inspired by the early talks with his beloved Uncle Edric. These challenges created some ups and downs that were balanced by a steadfast commitment to social and community activism.

Trevor led a full and complex life that afforded him the ability to relate to every and any one on every and any level. He was known for his penchant for debate fueled by a rich vocabulary and wealth of knowledge. He would give you the shirt off his back and he was always ready to lend a hand to those in need.

In his later years his crowning glory was his granddaughter, Desiree. He was a true Harlem gentleman, a dedicated son, complete and trustworthy friend and ally and loved his family with all of his heart until he could love no more in his unique style.

Trevor is survived by: his son, Trevor Rodger (and his wife, Cheryl); son, Craig Anthony (and his partner, Bruce Bowens); granddaughter, Desiree J.
