#### **Obituary**

**Alfred William Fleck** was born in New York on February 19, 1926 to William and Alberta Henry Fleck. He was the youngest of four children.

He lived all of his life in Harlem, and for many of those years he resided in the Johnson Projects.

Alfred married Enid Clark and he and his wife raised their two sons, Alfred, Jr. (aka "AL" or "Billy") and David Eugene. He was a dedicated father and assisted his sons to attend college.

He joined the Navy and served four years as a cook in World War II. Upon his discharge from the Navy, Alfred was employed for over thirty years by the Post Office at JFK Airport. He was never late, and rarely, if ever, called in sick. Throughout his life he remained highly punctual, and could not tolerate lateness from anyone.

After his marriage to Enid ended, Alfred met Christine Ruby Fields and they lived together in the Savoy Park Apartments. He was very devoted to Ruby, as she was fondly called, and remained her partner for many decades until her passing.

Alfred enjoyed traveling and visited such places as the Ivory Coast, West Africa and Hong Kong. He particularly loved taking Caribbean cruises and going to Las Vegas. He also liked going to Atlantic City with his best friend Sonny.

Until recently, he was an active member of St. Phillips Church in Harlem.

Fiercely independent and known by his family to be a man of few words, his wit and humor would always catch you off guard. He also played a mean game of Checkers.

Alfred was predeceased by Enid, Ruby, his siblings, Orville Fleck, Louise Sneed, and Gloria Jean Mason, which whom he was very close, and two nephews, Raymond Sneed and Ronald Pringle.
