### Obituary



**Jesse Lee Leggett** departed this life on October 22, 2017, after a long battle with Parkinson's disease. Above all others, he leaves behind his devoted wife, Anna Leggett, to whom he was married 55 years.

Jesse was born in Beaufort County, North Carolina, the first of twelve children. He was tinkering with car engines by the age of 6, and as he grew older he displayed a natural talent for fixing all things mechanical. In 1959, he moved to New Jersey to find better employment, and his first job here was in a factory at Seton Leather

Company in North Newark. He then went on to work for Avalon Corporation in Cedar Grove, manufacturing fiberglass insulation. He worked at Avalon for thirteen years, eventually becoming a manager. When Avalon went out of business in 1976, Jesse relied on his mechanical skills for employment and worked in auto repair shops before opening Jesse's Auto Service in 1980, located at 696 Bergen Street in Newark. He operated Jesse's Auto for 35 years, providing the community with honest and professional car repair services. For those who could not afford necessary repairs, Jesse often fixed their cars for free.

Besides providing for his family, Jesse's other passion was drag racing. In 1965 he bought a brand new Pontiac GTO for \$3500, and modified the engine for racing on the street. He won his first race, then another and another, and soon Jesse became known on the street racing circuit as "Big Red." Over time he befriended many racecar enthusiasts in the tristate area, including Danny Jesel, with whom Jesse developed high-performance engines and began adding nitrous oxide to fuel to boost a car's horsepower! Jesse remained ahead of all his competitors and went on to become a New Jersey drag-racing legend. Jesse raced cars – including driving them – into his early 70s, and continued to consult with others and attend car races until his body would no longer permit.

Jesse was extremely insightful and wise. He never missed an opportunity to dispense wisdom to whoever he thought could use it, even if they hadn't asked. People often sought Jesse's advice, however, including many of the young men he met while racing. Jesse mentored many kids in the Bergen Street neighborhood surrounding his shop as well. He was especially proud of his godson, Johnath Davis, whom he guided from the age of five (after repairing Johnath's great-grandma's car) through and beyond Johnath's college graduation. In October 2013, Jesse and Anna stood as Johnath's parents at his wedding, and Johnath blessed Jesse with another grandson last December.

Throughout the years Jesse attended Mount Vernon Baptist Church where his wife Anna has been a member for more than 40 years. In May 2013 he became a member and was baptized.



Jesse and Anna had their first date in January 1960 at Ben's Cotton Club on Frelinghuysen Avenue in Newark. They married two years later and their son Wayne was born in 1963. Their daughter Wendy was born five years after Wayne, and the family lived in the Vailsburg area of Newark for more than 25 years before moving to Union in 1990.



In addition to his wife, Anna, Jesse leaves to cherish his memories his daughter Wendy Leggett Faulk (Sean) and granddaughters Sydney Faulk and Christina Danner (Frank) and four great grandchildren: Levi, Sofie, Della and Frank; grandson Jon Jesse Leggett; godson Johnath Davis (Mary) and grand godson Levi; siblings Bettie Bell (Harvey), Nellie Taylor; Daniel Leggett (Louvenia); Hattie Leggett; James Leggett (Roslyn); Larry Leggett (Sherrie); Bonnie Leggett; Ann Elizabeth Reddick; Joanne Holloway (David); Jessie Brown; first cousin Leonard Stevenson (Millie) whom he always referred to as his brother-friend; and many, many nieces, nephews and cousins.

Jesse was predeceased by his mother and father, Rosa Lee and Simon Louis Leggett; son Wayne; sisters Ethel Marie Leggett and Gladys Brown; and brother Simon Leggett.
