Obituary

Dr. Wilson Chukwunwike Obi, a Professor of Physics at Medgar Evers University and resident of East Orange NJ, died unexpectedly on August 16, 2017 at the age of 77 while in Nigeria.

Wilson was born in the Village of Umuru, Ogidi Anambra State Nigeria on June 9 1940. He placed very high value on education and loved to teach others - something instilled in him by his Igbo culture. After graduating from Afikpo Government College Wilson immigrated to New Jersey in 1962.

Wilson earned a Bachelor's Degree in Aeronautical Engineering at Princeton University from 1962-1966. He then attended Brown University where he was awarded a Master's of Science in engineering in 1968. He received his PhD in Applied Mathematics from Stevens Institute of Technology in 1975.

Wilson was a proud father and even prouder grandfather. He was an avid reader - always wanting to further educate himself. He also loved intellectual conversations with friends and would happily discuss politics over dinner with friends. He will be deeply missed by his friends, family, and all who knew him.

Wilson is survived by his wife, Chinwe Chukwuma, his sons Chukwunwike, Ogidika and Kamsi, his grandchildren Ketzia, Zoe and Damon; his sister Caroline. Nieces and Nephews. Chi Obi-Nutter and the Fishers his adoptive U.S. Family.
