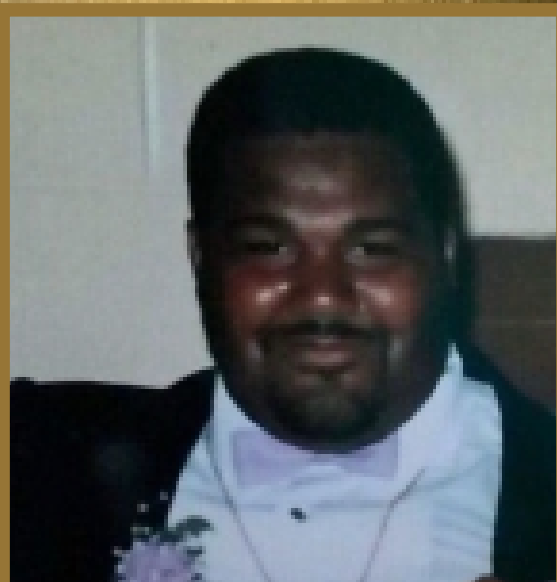


In Loving Memory of
