Lushima R. Dunn was born on June 24, 1975 in Paterson, NJ to the late Vantress Dunn and Allen Watson. At age seven, her family moved to Newark, NJ where she lived before making her transition on November 14th 2017.

Lushima attended Louise A. Spencer Elementary School and graduated in 1990. There after, she attended Malcolm X Shabazz High School, Chestnut Street High School and finished up at Central High School in Newark, class of 1994.

Since age fourteen, Lushima has worked various jobs throughout the summer through Newark's Summer Youth Employment and Training Program. In her early 20's she would then move on to doing security at Newark Liberty International Airport where she quickly worked her way up to a supervisory position. Because she wanted to provide a better life for her son that she had given birth to in 1992, she decided to take the test and become a correctional officer. After working in the prison system for ten years, she ended her corrections career at Fort Dix Federal Correctional Facility.

In 2007, Lushima started her career at Community Access Unlimited as an assistant support counselor working with the developmentally disabled. She spent the last ten years of her life working here providing love, guidance and support to her members and her coworkers.

Lushima leaves to cherish her memory: her son, Michael Green; grandmother, Mary Dunn; brother, Allen Dunn; sister, Tameka Negro; aunt, Yolanda Dunn; uncle, Mark Dunn; cousins, Maritza Gonzalez and Angel Marshad; and a host of nieces, nephews and special friends.
