

He had five (5) sisters, Eileen, Lynn, Muriel, Daphne (deceased) and Delta and two (2) brothers Patrick and Claudius. He got married to Myrtle Passard on March 28, 1964 and they were blessed with four (4) children, Denise (Lor), Patricia, Andrew and Gary. He also leaves behind daughter Carol from a previous relationship and stepsons Winston and Denver, grandchildren Stephanie, Ryan, Ana-Lauren, Ava-Simone, Aly-Renae, Winston, Justin, Julius, Nya, Kaiyana, Indya and Chris, sons-in-law Elton (Paul) and Mark, daughters-in-law Nadine (Dionne), Karlene (Kerry) and Audrey.

After the completion of High School, Derrick joined the Jamaica Constabulary Force where he spent thirty-two (32) years, worked his way up the ranks and was elevated to the position of Senior Superintendent of Police. After the races, everyone who attended would then drive just like the professionals that they had witnessed in action. He was also a cricket enthusiast in his earlier days and loved the sport so much that he named one of his sons after his favorite cricketer. In 1988, Derrick retired from the Jamaica Constabulary Force and migrated to the United States of America.

While living in Brooklyn, New York, Derrick continued in the same field of work and found a home at Tri-Way Security until 2007. Derrick loved music and dancing so much that he could spend his entire weekends just playing and listening to his wide collection. He enjoyed them a lot and would attend the West Indian Day Parade year after year, through sunshine or rain, even getting soaking wet one particular year. After that he continued to watch the events on television. Derrick was always the life of any party. The ladies would wait in line to get a dance with him. Derrick was a very low-keyed, laid-back, quiet, charming, fun-loving, affectionate, and overly protective father, husband, brother, uncle, grandfather, godfather and friend.








God Saw You Getting Tired
