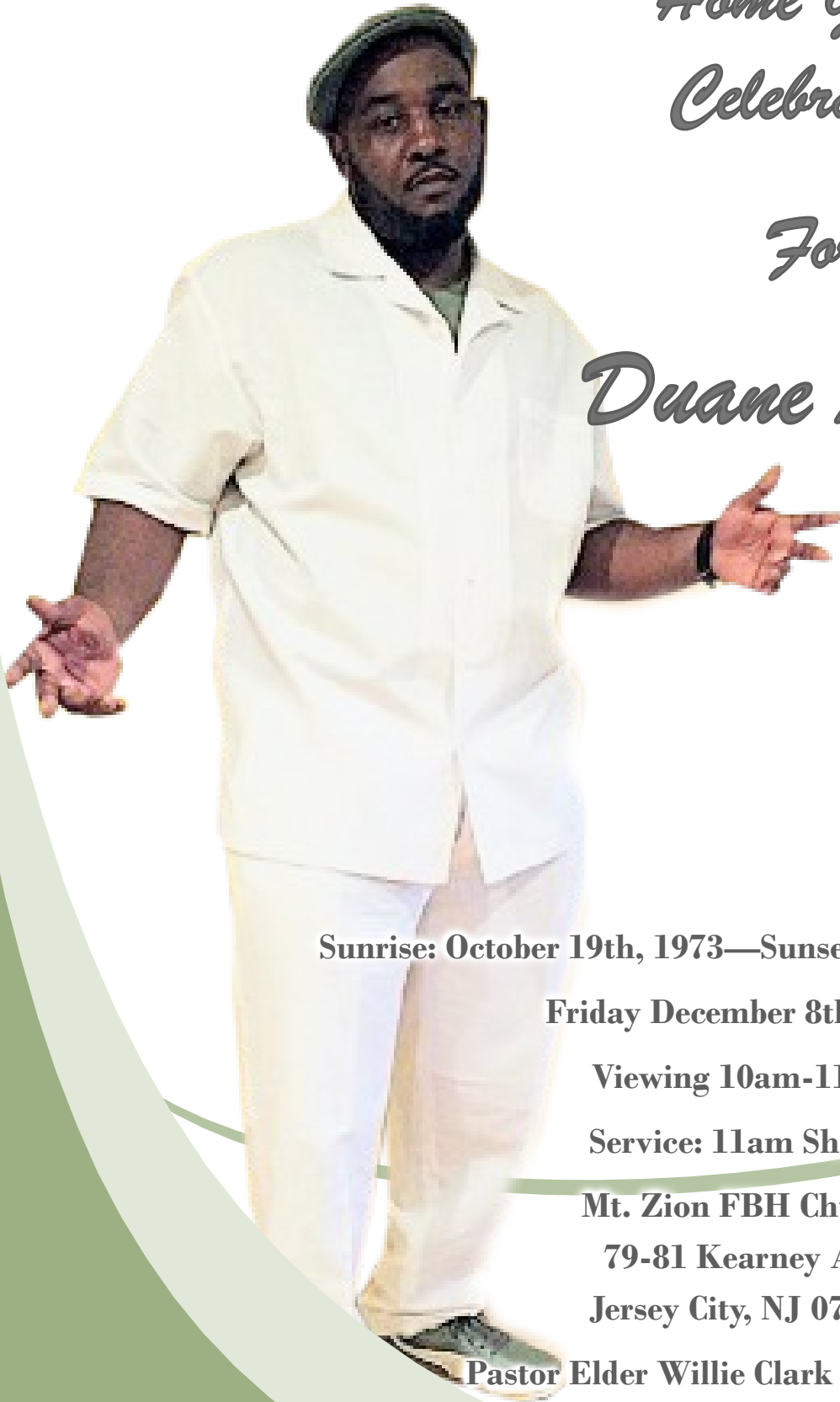

Duane Lamont Odom was born to Tommie Odom Sr. and Shirley D. King on October 19, 1973 at Margaret Hague Hospital in Jersey City, NJ. He transitioned home to be with the Lord on Sunday, December 3, 2017 from New York Presbyterian Hospital.

Duane grew up on 569 Montgomery Street, attended P.S. #9 grammar school and graduated in June 1991 from James J. Ferris H.S. in Jersey City. He attended evening classes to become a certified Journeyman Painter and worked for Jersey City Housing Authority. Though professional painting was his trade and passion, he also worked as a customer service representative for GSK, Securitas Inc. and One Call Medical in Parsippany, NJ.

Duane received his early Christian training at Mt. Calvary Baptist Church in Jersey City. He gave his heart to the Lord and accepted Jesus as his Savior at Faith Christian Center Ministries where he served as the church sexton until his death.

On March 28, 1998 he married Charlene Pittman and from this blessed union were 3 children.

Duane, affectionately known to some as “Fane Nubian”, was known for being cool, calm and fly (which was the caption under his high school yearbook picture). He was an avid football and basketball fan, and played football in high school. He was a music connoisseur with his favorite genre of music being jazz.
