

While delighting herself in the work of the Lord and raising her children as a single mother, she met James R. Duncan and married him in 2001. (2nd marriage)


Carlstine will be remembered as a loving wife, mother, prayer warrior, and friend. She touched the hearts of many and was a true blessing to all that knew her.
