Obituary

Daniel Carter Jr. was born March 17, 1937 in Orange, NJ to Althea and Daniel Carter, Sr. He was the stepson of Reginald DuValier. Daniel graduated from East Orange High School at the age of sixteen and went on to earn a Bachelor's Degree from St. Paul's College in Lawrenceville, VA. While at St. Paul's College, he played and lettered in football and basketball. He went on to earn Master's Degrees from King College and Columbia University, and a doctorate from Rutgers University.

Dan began his career in the Newark School District, working his way through the ranks from teacher to Learning Disabilities Consultant, Principal and Director of Special Services. From 1973 to 1987, he worked as an administrator of the day school for the Child Adolescent Unit, Department of Psychiatry, University of Medicine and Dentistry New Jersey. Dan also worked as a school psychologist in the Montclair School District. After retiring from Montclair, Dan and his wife relocated to Absecon, NJ, where he worked for a number of years for AtlantiCare Health System as a counselor and as Director of The Teen Center at Atlantic City High School. He also did consulting work as a school psychologist for Atlantic City and Pleasantville school districts.

Dan was a proud member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. for fifty-one years. He held offices in the Newark and Atlantic City chapters. Dan was an unassuming person, never one to be in the limelight and always worked hard behind the scenes doing whatever he could to help others. He had a lifelong passion for sports and could be heard on any given game day giving advice and commentary (basically, "What kind of dumb play was that?") on his teams, the Giants, Knicks and Mets.

Above all, Dan was a person who put everyone else first and looked out for the well being of others. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

Dan was preceded in death by his parents and stepfather. He leaves to cherish his memory his wife of thirty-three years, Marilyn Hall Carter; son, Daniel Scott Carter; granddaughter, Kylah Joy Carter, sister, Regina DuValier (Clyde); niece, Cory DuValier; aunt, Annie Van Clief; and other relatives and friends.
