Obituary

Charles Therlange Cadet was born in St Marc, Haiti on July 7, 1951. He passed away six months into his 66th birthday.

Charles was someone who loved his siblings a lot. He was sentimental when it came to his family members. Some even found him to be possessive.

Much like his siblings and many children of his generation, he attended the school which his father Wilfrid Jean Baptiste Cadet and his courageous wife Solange Banica had founded. After his primary education in his hometown St. Marc, he moved to Port-au-Prince to continue his secondary education at the Lycée Anténor Firmin. As a youth, his time was spent mostly on activities like soccer, volleyball, karate, billiard and cards.

After obtaining his Bachelor's Degree in Accounting at a Business School in Haiti, he began working as an Accountant in the private business sector in Port-au-Prince. He also studied Law at the Law School of the State University of Haiti and taught Math and Physics during that same period. While he was working, studying and teaching, he was recruited by the National Bank of the Republic of Haiti. He worked there for a little while then decided to join the love of his life Nanie Dormus in the United States.

He married his wife on February 10, 1979, with whom he had two children: Ariel Cadet and Regine Cadet. After settling in New Jersey, he decided to continue his passion for Accounting and Computer Science while working at Midatlantic Bank, Summit Bank and Wachovia Bank as a Supervisor of the Data Processing Department. He worked at Wachovia for many years supporting his family and anyone of his close friends who needed a helping hand. After retiring from Wachovia, he later took on a job with Green Taxi to occupy his time.

Charles could be direct and vocal in his opinions, but his main strengths were essentially his humility, his altruism and generosity. Those personality traits will have left deep traces on family members and friends during and after his lifetime. There's nothing that Charles wouldn't do for his friends and family.

Although he never took a clear position to serve Jehovah God, Charles enjoyed reading the Awake magazines. During the latter part of his life, Charles was always eager to attend the Memorial of Christ death each year with his wife.

Charles leaves behind his wife, Nanie Cadet, 2 children (Ariel and Regine), 2 grand-children (Evan and Eli), his mother (Solange Cadet), siblings (Mona, Emmeline, Necker, Hervie, Yola, Warens, Wilfrid Jr., Emmery, Harry, Norma, Rodolphe), a host of nephews, nieces, cousins, daughter-in-law, brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law and many caring friends whom he loved. He will be dearly missed by all who loved him.

He was preceded in death by his father (Wilfrid Jean Baptiste Cadet) and older brother (Russell Cadet).
